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

#### Why care about adolescents

- 1) Lower maternal mortality and morbidity
- 2) Prevent HIV transmission and its consequences
- 3) Improve schooling achievement
- 4) Raise gender equality
- 5) Reduce poverty

## Adolescents constitute about 1 in 4 of of the world's reproductive age population in 2009


**Proportion 10-19 years among the 10-59 year olds** 





### Adolescence is a time when changes in sexual activity happen fast




## And the pace of change is similar for adolescent males



### Early marriage is still very common in many developing countries


% married before age 20 among 20-24 year old women



#### Contraceptive Use, Unmet Need and Unintended pregnancy


#### At least 1 in 5 sexually active adolescent women aged 15-19 are using contraception (any method)





Sexually active never-married adolescent females are more likely to use contraception than their married counterparts




Levels of unmet need for contraception are higher among sexually active never-married adolescent females than among those who are married.




## Less than half of young men use condoms consistently

## Unwanted and mistimed pregnancies are a major problem among adolescents




### Barriers to Access to FP Information and Services

#### Adolescents face barriers accessing FP/SRH information and services


- The following evidence is from a recent nationally representative study of adolescents in four Sub-Saharan countries: Burkina Faso, Ghana, Malawi and Uganda.
- The study included a survey of male and female adolescents aged 12-19 with a sample size ranging from 4,012 in Ghana to 5,950 in Uganda.
- The countries were chosen to reflect the diverse contexts of adolescents' lives in the region, in order to allow for some generalization of the findings.

#### Detailed knowledge of pregnancy prevention is lacking



### At best, only about half of adolescents receive any school-based sex education.


#### % of 15-19-year-olds




Attended school, had sex education

### Fear or embarrassment is the main barrier to getting contraception (Uganda)

#### **Reality check**

- Adolescents are sexually active and most of them do so voluntarily.
- Although many of them are doing their best to protect themselves against the consequences of unprotected sex, many still lag behind.
- Failure to achieve desired level of protection results in high levels of unintended pregnancies and HIV/AIDS in some parts of the world.
- Policies and programs that reflect the reality of teens' lives and meet their SRH needs comprehensively are urgently needed.
